TOP CADET FIRST AID TEAM ON VANCOUVER ISLAND

On Sunday April 30, 2006 cadets from 1726 Canadian Scottish Regiment (Princess Mary's) Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corps competed in the Vancouver Island Zone First Aid Competition located in Nanaimo, BC. After a long day of competition, the Senior Team from 1726 RCACC placed first out of 6 other cadet first aid teams to win the zone competition. This was a big win for 1726 RCACC, as this Corps had not competed in this competition for well over 10 years. First aid in the Canadian Cadet Movement brings together many of the aspects that Cadets strive to achieve. Cadets learn leadership, control in turbulent situations and most of all; they become better citizens by offering to learn a skill that can save lives.

The army cadet program is a federal government program delivered by the Department of National Defence. The program is designed for youth who are interested in learning new skills, experiencing adventurous activities, national or international expeditions and travel, and meeting others with similar interests. Royal Canadian Army cadets was founded July 25, 1879 by Militia General Order 18 that authorized the formation of Drill Associations for boys aged 14 and above. It was not until 1975 that girls were permitted to join the program. The aim of the cadet organization is to develop in youth the attributes of good citizenship, and leadership; promote physical fitness; and stimulate an interest in the activities of the Canadian Forces.
